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Psalms 14:1 "for the choir director. A Psalm of David. The

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David and
Abigail
(1 Samuel 25)

fool says in his heart, There is no God.

They are corrupt, they have committed
abominable deeds; there is no one who
does good." (NASB)

Questions

- Have you ever spoke to anyone who said
There is no God, or someone who doesn't
believe in the existence of God?
- What does this mean "There is no one who does good"?
Was this inclusive of all people on earth?
 - those who have no rule of God in their lives.
Colossians 3:8-9 } anger, gossip, malice, envy,
Galatians 5:19-21 } strife, jealousy, slander,
dissensions, divisions, envy,
lying -
 - Paul's warning is that
those who do such things
will not inherit the Kingdom
of God.

Psalms 14:2 "The Lord looks down from Heaven upon
the sons of men to see if there are any
who understand, who seek after God."

Yeshua said in Matthew 6:33 "But seek first the kingdom and His righteousness, and all things will be added to you."

Questions

- What does it mean to seek the kingdom of God?
 - What does it mean to seek His righteousness?
 - * It says "the kingdom" and "His righteousness" these seem to be two separate things?
 - Those who say there is no rule of God in their lives
 - are corrupt
 - their deeds show a pattern of life that is an indication of the inward spiritual state.
- 1 John 3:8 "the one who practices sin is of the devil; for the devil has sinned from the beginning, The Son of God appeared for this purpose, to destroy the works of the devil."
- The life of a child of God should be characteristic of seeking the Lord, His kingdom, and His Righteousness

- Psalms 14:3 "They have all turned aside, together they have become corrupt; there is no one that does good, not even one."
- the way of mankind is corrupted, this is why we seek the Help of the Lord.

- This Psalm reminds us of the words of the apostle Paul in Romans 3:1-3. (3)
- Romans 3:10-12 a quote from Psalms 14.

Summary Romans 3

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- No confidence in the flesh
- Man does not nullify the faithfulness of God.
- Paul describes those who do not seek God (Psalms 14).
- The Torah (Law) was given so no man can boast
- Each man is accountable to God.
- The mercy, Grace, and redemption of God.
- God is the one who justifies for righteousness
— therefore no man can boast.
- Paul concludes that this does not nullify the Law,
on the contrary, this establishes the Law. ↪

How do we understand the Law in this context? ↩

Deuteronomy 28:1 "if you ^{listen} to the voice of the Lord
your God..."

"^{לִשְׁמֹר} תָּשִׂמְחַת נֵסֶת פְּנֵי קָדְשֶׁךָ שְׁמַעַת סִירָם וְנֵסֶת וְנֵסֶת פְּנֵי כָּלְבִּיךְ"

↙ uses the imperfect verb form for listening or
hearing the voice of the Lord God.

- this indicates that the process of listening and our relationship with God is an ongoing process that is not yet complete.

- This illustrates that our relationship with God is an ongoing life long process.

→ we are to seek His kingdom and His righteousness,
 → Hearing the voice of God
 → obeying the Lord
 → obeying His word } Establishment of Torah (Law) in our lives.

John 8:31 "If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of mine."

- obeying
- continuing in
- keeping
- Being true disciples.

- * In order to be the true children of Abraham, we need to have the Word of God inside in order to sustain, support, and give us life.

Psalms 14 } Seeking the Lord salvation
 Romans 3 }
 John 8 }
 → Lives that demonstrate that
 → The Lord's salvation.
 → The Lord's Righteousness. (Page 8)
 → The Lord's Redemption.
 → The Lord's Deliverance.

- * Righteousness is a gift of God, but this does not exclude us from living righteously before the Lord in our day to day lives.

→ we should have an ongoing desire to live for Him!
