Brain Reading and Technologies that can Change Brain Activity – A Spiritual Insight

Technology is moving very fast these days, and so the advances in these areas are quickly developing. Some of the types of technologies are using these advances to change brain waves to speech, and bracelets that use nerve impulses for typing without a keyboard, and even connecting prosthetics to head-sensors allowing for prosthetics to move for paralytics, etc. The researchers are looking to be able to listen to the neural chatter in our brains and understand what is the underlying meanings, and even using AI technology to help decipher our thoughts. This kind of technology could drastically change the lives of those who have lost the use of their arms and/or legs. This technology has the capability however to be used very nefariously for bad purposes. Especially when one uses the technology to reshape our thoughts.

The idea of reading information directly from the brain has been a sought after goal of many researchers. This would be a valuable tool for those who can no longer move. This is

the end goal of this type of research. relatively recently it has been reported the capability to decode speech signals from the brain when one was unable to speak. [5] Today extracting information from the brain requires bulky head gear and intense computer processing power. The early results of this technology is that predictive algorithms make good guesses at what the brain is thinking. Scientists believe they may gain insights into how to access our neurological data by studying neurology research which may eventually lead to even the subconscious thoughts being revealed with further technological advances. There is a neurotechnology company based out of Los Angeles selling what is called a "Kernel Flow helmet" which uses a near-infrared spectroscopy technique, sending electromagnetic (EM) radiation through the skull and into the brain. The EM field reflects off of tissue and blood and is received on sensors that measure oxygen levels. These oxygen levels indicate where brain-nerve-cells are active providing clues to the ongoing mental processes.

Because technology is moving fast, there are people who are proposing strict laws to regulate the issues of privacy due to the proprietary nature of neural data that is in one's brain. The major issue here is there are companies who would do almost anything to get at everyone's neural data and then data mine this information for their own purposes, for profit, etc. There are also those who claim that moving forward with this technology to help people with mental illness or paralysis is an ethical imperative, and this outweighs the fear of privacy violations. Others believe that one should have the right to sell one's own neural data for a product or service, or for cash. This suggests the brain has become an asset that will generate much profit in the future once we unlock the secrets of the brain with technology.

When we lay the scientific research down alongside the Scriptures, the Spiritual Insights that we receive from this type of research is related to the development of this brain reading technology. When reading these papers, there is a certain level of expertise that is required in order to begin the research. In addition, there must be a multidisciplinary approach as no one person is capable of working in all areas simultaneously such as interpreting the neurological data, the computer algorithms, the electronic components, and hardware development, etc. A team of researchers and manufacturers are necessary in order to take advantage of a broad range of expertise. As we can see from the research papers, it will take years and years to achieve the end goal. The dreams, desires, vision of the developers will eventually come to its fulfillment. When we study the Bible, we see how the Lord God Almighty created all life and this universe. We are also told in the Scriptures that He had wisdom and understanding to do so. We read according to the book of Jeremiah an interesting perspective as the Word of the Lord came to Jeremiah in Jeremiah 1 and the Lord tells Jeremiah that before He formed him in the womb, He knew him. This speaks to the designer who has a vision of what He wants out of His creation similar to the desires of the scientific community to develop brain reading technologies.

29:11 'FOR I KNOW THE PLANS THAT I HAVE FOR YOU,' DECLARES THE LORD, 'PLANS FOR WELFARE AND NOT FOR CALAMITY TO GIVE YOU A FUTURE AND A HOPE. 29:12 'THEN YOU WILL CALL UPON ME AND COME AND PRAY TO ME, AND I WILL LISTEN TO YOU. 29:13 'YOU WILL SEEK ME AND FIND ME WHEN YOU SEARCH FOR ME WITH ALL YOUR HEART. 29:14 'I WILL BE FOUND BY YOU,' DECLARES THE LORD, 'AND I WILL RESTORE YOUR FORTUNES AND WILL GATHER YOU FROM ALL THE NATIONS AND FROM ALL THE PLACES WHERE I HAVE DRIVEN YOU,' DECLARES THE LORD, 'AND I WILL BRING YOU BACK TO THE PLACE FROM WHERE I SENT YOU INTO EXILE.' (NASB)

Here the specific verse we are interested in is Jeremiah 29:11, which states, יא כּי אָנֹכִי יָדַעְתָּי אָת-הַמּחָשָׁבֹת אָשֶׁר אָנֹכִי חשָׁב עְלֵיכָם נָאָם-יָהֹוָה מַחָשָׁבוֹת שָׁלוֹש וְלֹא לְרָעָה לָתַת לָכָם אַחַרִית וְתַּקְוַה: *"For I know the* plans (אַת-הַמְּחַשְׁבֹת) that I have for you,' declares the Lord (אַת-הַמְּחַשְׁבֹת), 'plans for welfare (שָׁלוֹם , peace) and not for calamity (וְלא לְרָעָה, and not evil) to give you a future (אַמָרִית) and a hope (אַמָּרִית)." We note how this parallels the scientific research from the sense of the designer having a plan and vision for the future of his creation. We see here in God's words to the people of Israel, these are not just words to Jeremiah, they are for a nation of people. So when we read these verses, the questions one might ask are, "If God already has a plan for me, why should I pray?" and "If He already knows what I want, why should I tell Him?" When we consider the verses that speak of God having a foreknowledge as knowing us before we were created, this suggests that God knows who we are and what we were capable of, and what we will become. The all knowing God also understands our circumstances and the events that are occurring in our lives. He knows what we want and what we need and as Jeremiah states, "For I know the plans (אַת-הַמְּחַשֶּׁבֹת) that I have for you,' declares the Lord (אָנֹכִי חשֵׁב עֲלֵיכֶם נְאֶם-יְהֹנָה), 'plans for welfare (שָׁלוֹם, peace) and not for calamity (וְלֹאָ לְרָעָה), and not evil) to give you a future (אָחֶרִית) and a hope (וְתֹקוֶה)." These things teach us that God has a plan for our lives, and He knows best how to accomplish His plan for our lives. So, "why should we pray with requests to God?" This approach suggests that God has every detail worked out in our lives, exactly what we are going to do each day in our job, marriage, college, etc. Is this what the Scriptures really tell us about how the Lord functions in our lives? This is a very important question, and illustrates why studying Torah is so important for our lives today, especially for understanding these things and getting answers for these questions! By studying the Torah we learn something about God and His creation. We learn that God's plan for our lives is more "fluid" or "dynamic" than we realized. Note also understanding these things requires one to have read the Scriptures, and doing so year after year after year, all of our lives.

(Bereshit / Genesis 28:13-15) Then we read how the nation of Israel grew to great numbers while in servitude to Egypt. The Lord God delivered His people from Bondage, destroyed the Egyptian Army, and brought His people to the Mountain of Sinai. It is here we read how Moshe went up the mountain, and while he was upon the mountain, the people made for themselves a golden calf. (Parashat Ki Tisa, Shemot / Exodus 32) It was this particular point in time in which the Lord God informed Moshe of what He was about to do to Israel because of her sin.

The idea here in the pages of the Torah speaks to how the Lord God was going to destroy Israel and start over with Moshe making him into a great nation. This seems contradictory to His plan that He had for the nation as having promised Abraham his descendants would be vast and numerous. The question is that if God had destroyed Israel and made Moshe into a great nation, would this contradict what God had promised to Abraham? No, since Moshe was also a descendant of Abraham and so making Him a great nation would NOT lead to a contradiction in terms. The point here is, God's plan remains, and yet we see how

Moshe was able to dissuade God from destroying the people. We note that in this case, God told Moshe directly what He was going to do to the people. In our own lives, we do not know exactly what God is going to do! Moshe prayed and persuaded God to not destory ISrael, and he did this through prayer! Notice how God's plan was in place, yet Moshe praying in supplication and intercession on behalf of Israel changed the path by which the plan proceeded. Destroying the nation due to her sins was God's plan, and then Moshe interceded to change the outcome of their sin. (Note, this is how Yeshua functions in our lives as our savior!) In these Scriptures, Moshe argues with God to not kill the people. (Shemot / Exodus 32:10-13, אַפִּי בָהֶם וֹאָכֵלֶם וֹאָשֶשֶׁה אוֹתְךְּ לְגוֹי נְּדוֹל , riֹן וְעַתָּה הַנִּיְחָה לִי וְיִחֵר-אַפִּי בָהֶם וֹאָכֵלֶם וֹאָשֶשֶׁה אוֹתְךְּ לְגוֹי נְּדוֹל , and the Lord God relents to what he had determined to do. The Torah is revealing to us why prayer and supplication (making requests) are so important!

We note other examples from the Torah, as God having knowledge of what was to happen, yet He asked where Adam and Eve were in Bereshit / Genesis 3:9. Take another example on the Lord telling Abraham to sacrifice his only son Isaac (Bereshit / Genesis 22). The point of these narratives is to show us that prayer is not ineffectual when God knows all. We are not told, but can you imaging how Abraham was praying while making his trip to Mount Moriah to sacrifice his only son? The point of revealing these things to Moshe may have been for the Lord to understand how Moshe understood these things. In this situation, the Lord was seeing what Moshe thought and how he would respond to God's plan. Note how the Torah also reveals to us that God does not control our thoughts. He wants to hear our thoughts, wants, and desires. We notice how Moshe through his prayer did not change God's plan for the nation of Israel as He promised to Abraham. Either way God's plan would have been fulfilled! It was however through prayer and supplication that led to exactly how that plan God had was fulfilled! This is a significant thing the Scriptures are teaching us! It is in this way that as we pray, our thoughts, our feelings, our supplication, and our submission to God's Word, we are showing to whom we belong, taking our stand with the Lord by seeking His help. It is by our prayer requests that we find ourselves seeking God in heaven to help us to live our lives for His glory. The Torah reveals to us how the Lord God is looking for our interactive participation with His plan through prayer. These things reveal also how our relationship with God and His Messiah Yeshua is very important and yet very fluid / dynamic! David wrote almost half of the psalms and many of which were for the purpose of asking the Lord to meet his struggles and desires with hope, success, and salvation. This is how David is called a man after God's own heart. Our relationship with God is not a passive one, but an active one as we seek His will. So when we look at our own situation, we can know that God is going to carry out His will in our lives no matter what. Our prayers however shape and mold how God works out His plan, how the Lord works out the necessary steps to get there. This is what Paul meant when he said "work out your salvation with fear and trembling" according to Philippians 2:12. When we do this, we also must be aware that the Lord God may have a different idea than we have in our mind's. We can live however with confidence, that no matter how our lives play out, the Lord will take care of us!

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
