

## Our Strength is in Him!

In this weeks reading from Parashat Vayechi (*Bereshit / Genesis 47:28-50:26*) is the final chapters of the book of Genesis. The opening verses tell us that Jacob (Israel) lived in the land of Egypt seventeen years and the total length of his life were 147 years. Jacob tells Joseph that his two sons will be his (48:5) and declares that Joseph’s descendents after him shall be called after their names (48:6). Jacob then proceeds to make statements against his sons on account of what they had done while in the land of Canaan (49:1-26). (NASB)</p>

יד וַיִּשְׁלַח יִשְׂרָאֵל אֶת-יָמֵינוּ וַיָּשֶׁתּוּ עַל-רֹאשׁ אֶפְרַיִם וְהָיָה הַצַּעֲרִיר וְאֶת-שְׂמָאלוֹ עַל-רֹאשׁ מְנַשֶּׁה כִּי מְנַשֶּׁה הַבְּכוֹר: 48:14 *But Israel stretched out his right hand and laid it on the head of Ephraim, who was the younger, and his left hand on Manasseh's head, crossing his hands, although Manasseh was the firstborn.* (NASB) While blessing Joseph’s sons, Jacob realized that God does not always choose the first born but in many instances He chooses the unusual thing to complete His will. For example in the Bible God uses common people to do his work. God often chooses the weak to do His will, *1 Corinthians 1:27 but God has chosen the foolish things of the world to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong,* (NASB) David says in *Tehillim / Psalms 8* ג מִפִּי יְנַקִּים יְסֻדָּתָ עַז לְמַעַן צוֹרְרֵיךָ לְהַשְׁבִּית אוֹיְבֵי וּמִתְנַקֵּם: 8:2 *From the mouth of infants and nursing babes You have established strength Because of Your adversaries, To make the enemy and the revengeful cease.* (NASB) The Lord establishes his strength in the mouth of “infants” and “nursing babes.” According to the Apostolic Gospels, in order for us to be strong and mighty in the Lord, we are to become as infants (*Matthew 18:3*). Weakness in our culture is generally viewed as despicable. As a culture, we place value on strength, independence, and achievement. However, the Lord said their is strength in weakness. The reason being is to illustrate our total dependence upon the Lord for all of our needs. As you become more mature in the Lord (*in Christ, in the Messiah*) and grow in your relationship with Him, is your dependence upon the Lord increased or decreased? Truly our strength is in Him alone!
