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In this week's reading from the Triennial cycle (*Devarim / Deuteronomy 10:12-11:25*) Moshe is calling Yisrael to walk by faith and to walk in God's ways by submitting to the authority of the Word of God (His commandments). In last week's study (*Parashat Vaetchanan*), we looked at how Ezra set for us an example of a life lived for the Lord and drawing near to God by (i) studying the Scriptures, (ii) practicing what he learned, and (iii) teaching what the Lord had laid upon his heart for the people. *Ezra 7:10* and (iii) teaching what the Lord had laid upon his heart for the people. *Ezra 7:10 For Ezra had set his heart to study the law of the Lord and to practice it, and to teach His statutes and ordinances in Israel*.) This week, Moshe recounts the story of Yisrael's covenant relationship with God and her miraculous exodus from Egypt (see *Devarim / Deuteronomy 9:1-29*). After recounting the history of Yisrael's deliverance, Moshe instructs the people to fear the Lord, obey His commandments, and to love the Lord with all your heart and all your soul in *Devarim / Deuteronomy 10:12*)

10:12 'Now, Israel, what does the Lord your God require from you, but to fear the Lord your God, to walk in all His ways and love Him, and to serve the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, 10:13 and to keep the Lord's commandments and His statutes which I am commanding you today for your good? 10:14 'Behold, to the Lord your God belong heaven and the highest heavens, the earth and all that is in it. 10:15 'Yet on your fathers did the Lord set His affection to love them, and He chose their descendants after them, even you above all peoples, as it is this day. 10:16 'So circumcise your heart, and stiffen your neck no longer. 10:17 'For the Lord your God is the God of gods and the Lord of lords, the great, the mighty, and the awesome God who does not show partiality nor take a bribe. Moshe understands that Yisrael will be victorious because God has promised they will be. He also knows that because of this victory the people may fall into pride and self confidence when he says in Devarim / Deuteronomy 9:4 "Do not say in your heart ... because of my righteousness the Lord has brought me to posses this land." From a practical aspect for us today, success, blessing, and prosperity, it is easy for us to look at those who have no relationship with God having rejected Yeshua the Messiah to turn around and put ourselves in a higher category believing that we are somehow favored by God and have a special status before God by our own doing. This mindset goes something like this: "because, when I was confronted by the gospel I was smart enough to make the right choice and therefore am worthy of God's blessings." When we have embraced Yeshua as our Messiah and Savior, followed the Torah, reaped the rewards of righteous living, our families are blessed, kept away from the abominations of the nations, enjoyed the blessings of the festivals, and the Shabbat, what response do we have? That we deserve this life because we have obeyed and thus we have earned it? Are we better than the unsaved because we have kept God's commands? Be very careful about this kind of mindset, "watch out." The desire to obey God, faith, and the blessings that come, and even our decision to follow the Lord is the result of God having chosen us to be His. The way we are today, who we are, where we live, our jobs, salvation, and even our faith is a matter of His grace being imparted to us. He has shown us the Messiah and given us His Spirit as a gift of His infinite grace. The rewards God gives us are an extension of His own gracious work within us. In fact, the process of drawing near to God, the blessings that are mentioned are revealed to us in His Word this week. God wants us to have a one to one relationship with Him. Like we discovered in last week's reading (Parashat Vaetchanan) the use of the singular pronoun is also used in *Devarim / Deuteronomy 10:12* when Moshe speaks to Yisrael, he uses the singular pronoun instead of the second person plural pronoun.

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As we learned last week, the singular pronoun in the Hebrew language can be used to denote the corporate identity of all of Yisrael. Also note that the independent singular personal pronoun (817) can refer to all of Yisrael, see Parashat Balak and Bamidbar / Numbers 22:12. When the singular is used in texts where God is addressing Yisrael, the singular form of the pronoun also places some emphasis upon the individual highlighting the one-to-one relationship we have with God. This emphasis is revealed to us by the use of the singular "you" in the initial giving of the Shema in *Devarim / Deuteronomy* 6:4-9 which is later changed to the plural form "you" in the reiteration of the Shema in Devarim / Deuteronomy 11:13. The duality of the use of the singular pronoun that refers to (i) all of Yisrael and (ii) to each individual believer shows us the connection of community, family, and individuality that is a characteristic part of being a member of the body of Messiah (Christ). As you can see below, I circled all of the singular pronouns used in Devarim / Deuteronomy 6:4-9 and the reiteration of the Shema in *Devarim / Deuteronomy 11:13* that show the use of the second person plural pronoun. The singular to plural shift in the text $(6:4-9 \rightarrow$ 11:13) indicates that the reiteration of the Shema is to the corporate body of believers in 11:13. However, in 6:4-9 the use of the singular pronoun shows that the command is also bound up in the one-to-one relationship God has with each believer. These Scriptures show us that we are to have a personal relationship with God; the pronoun is used to represent the corporate nature of God's family.

The fact that God rewards those who obey Him is a result of the established covenant and relationship that we have with Him in Yeshua, and is an extension of His own gracious work within us. Paul speaks of this when he wrote in *Philippians 2:12-13* to "Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who is at work within you both to will and to work for His good pleasure." The Greek word used in *Philippians 2:13* is "energon" from "energos" meaning "at work, active, busy." The concept of this word is to be "with activity" in the state of being active, that the Father in Heaven is actively doing His work through us. As the Father worked in and through Yeshua (see *John 7:16, 14:10, 12:49-50, and 14:24*) so also the Father is working in and

If God is actively operating / working within us can we really take the credit for the blessings which God has brought upon us? *Romans 11:36 "For from Him and through Him are all things. To Him be the glory forever. Amen."*

In the Scriptures for this week we are reminded that the covenant God made with Yisrael and with us today is a two sided covenant. A covenant in which Yisrael was required to obey in order to be blessed and was also promised punishment for their disobedience. In the face of Yisrael's blunt disobedience, idolatry, and desire to be like the nations, God blesses Yisrael with His presence and His Word demonstrating (testifying) in the end His sovereign grace. The reiteration of the deliverance story (*Devarim / Deuteronomy 9:1-27*) reveals to us that God is very merciful because He ultimately was not limited to Yisrael alone. The conversation God had with Moshe about starting new by making a nation out of him illustrates that He could have wiped out all of Yisrael. The point is that God made a promise and a covenant with Yisrael and He will always keep His Word.

The scripture in *Devarim / Deuteronomy 10:12-17*, shown below, further illustrates the kind of heart we must have. *Devarim / Deuteronomy 11:18 'You shall therefore impress these words of mine on your heart and on your soul; and you shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontals on your forehead. 11:19 'You shall teach them to your sons, talking of them when you sit in your house and when you walk along the road and when you lie down and when you rise up. 11:20 'You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, (NASB) Again we see here the alternating use of the singular*

pronoun verses the plural form which illustrates the corporate dialog to the children of Yisrael while at the same time directing the individual to be speaking of the scriptures at all times. Speak of how God is working in your life in your house, when you are raising up and lying down, write the Scriptures on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

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10:12-17 דברים

The Scriptures this week are so very important for us because we are reminded that we should not be arrogant about our righteousness. Surely God's blessings come as we obey Him, but our obedience is ultimately the result of His work within us. Are you willing to allow God to work within you to produce much fruit? We are also reminded that our position is that of being "Forgiven" in Yeshua the Messiah. This position is purely the result of God's mercy and grace and not something we have earned. When Yisrael had finally possessed the Promised Land, they knew that it was entirely by God's blessing and power, so we also know that our standing in Yeshua is today entirely by the power of God in Yeshua, and not of our own strength. Having this understanding, let's not forget to remember these scripture verses:

Say this short prayer with me: "Heavenly Father, help me to be bold by proclaiming in both word and deed the good news of the Gospel of Yeshua. In Yeshua's name I pray. Amen!"
